

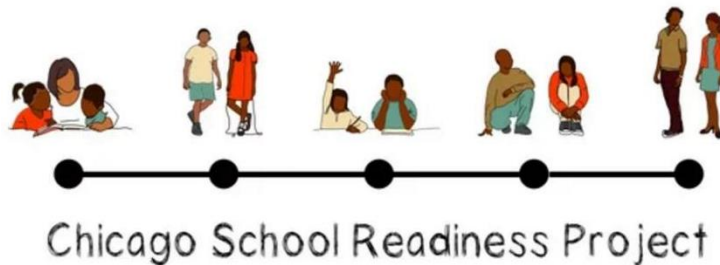
UNDERGRADS: WANT TO WORK IN A PSYCH LAB?
